









As Christians, we know we're supposed to love our neighbor.

(Luke 10:25-28)




Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. (NIV®)


Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against anyone among your people, but love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord. (NIV®)
