


1. Listen Well - We don't have all the answers so let's ask what others think, really try to hear each other out, and let




## How does the "already but not yet" tension of the kingdom of God help us navigate life?



How does the "already but not yet" tension of the kingdom of God help us navigate life? God's kingdom is already here, but not all the way. Luke 17:20-21 (ESV) 20 Being asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, he answered them, "The kingdom of God is not coming in ways that can be observed, 21 nor will they say, 'Look, here it is!' or 'There!' for behold, the kingdom of God is in the midst of you." (lesus is the kingdom manifest)





Matthew 13:31-32 (ESV)

- How does the "already but not yet" tension of the kingdom of God help us navigate life?
- God's kingdom comes in hidden & indiscernible ways.
- 31 He put another parable before them, saying, "The kingdom of heaven is like a grain of mustard seed that a man took and sowed in his field. 32 It is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is larger than all
- the garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches."




Those who mistakenly bring the kingdom too near (already) fall for utopianism, unrealistic expectations, politicized gospels, or, worst of all, the persecution of those who don't yet believe or who don't see things the same way. Those who keep the kingdom too distant (not yet) fall for prophecy chart fixations or cultural apathy or failed attempts to withdraw from society.




### **Revelation 21:1-6 (ESV)**

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. 2 And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. 3 And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. 4 He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." 5 And he who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true." 6 And he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give from the spring of the water of life without payment.





Revelation 21:24-27 (ESV) By its light will the nations walk, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it, 25 and its gates will never be shut by day—and there will be no night there. 26 They will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. 27 But nothing unclean will ever enter it, nor anyone who does what is detestable or false, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life. Does this change anything about the way we engage in our world today?



Revelation 22:1-5 (ESV) Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb 2 through the middle of the street of the city; also, on either side of the river, the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, yielding its fruit each month. The leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations. 3 No longer will there be anything accursed, but the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him. 4 They will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. 5 And night will be no more. They will need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.




In the meantime, it is our task to trust God to bring about the final end without confusing our imperfect efforts with his closing act. What this means in terms of history is that we should refrain from both excessive pessimism and excessive optimism when it comes to our actions in the public realm. This leads us to have an approach to society where we are committed to transformation without putting pressure on ourselves to usher in the ultimate triumph.

**Revelation 14:13** (ESV) And I heard a voice from heaven saying, "Write this: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on." "Blessed indeed," says the Spirit, "that <u>they may rest from their labors</u>, for their deeds follow them!" There are going to be failures on this earth and they are not going to be recognized for being either failures or successes until eternity. It's really hard to gauge what was good work now. So if you're gauging it based on what seems like a failure now, then that's not going to be a good way to gauge political actions. You can fight for causes you don't think will win. You can support cases that look really hopeless because everything will be judged in light of eternity, which things that looked insignificant now will look really significant.




