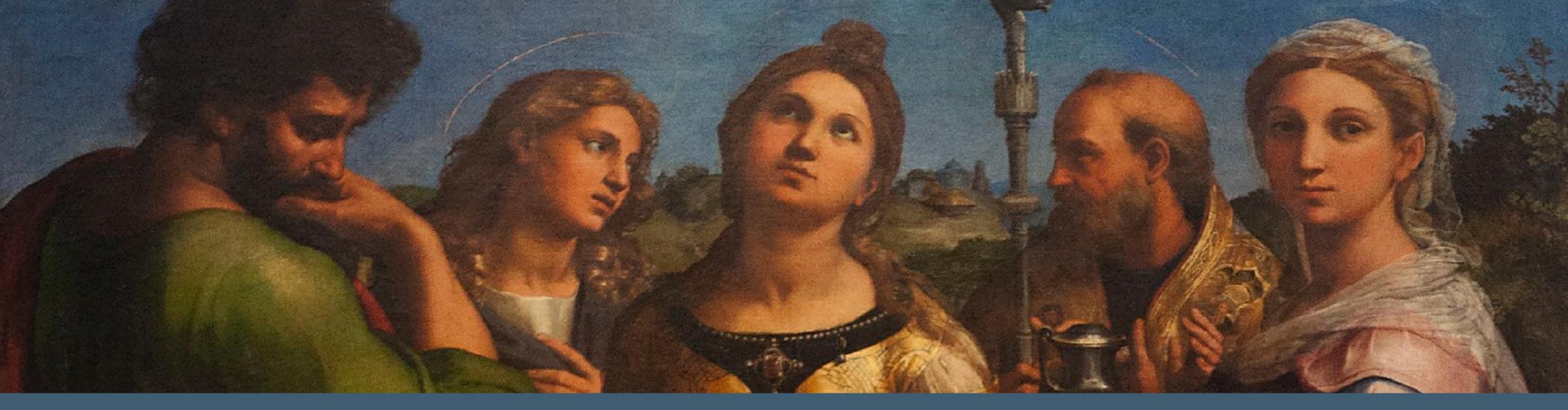




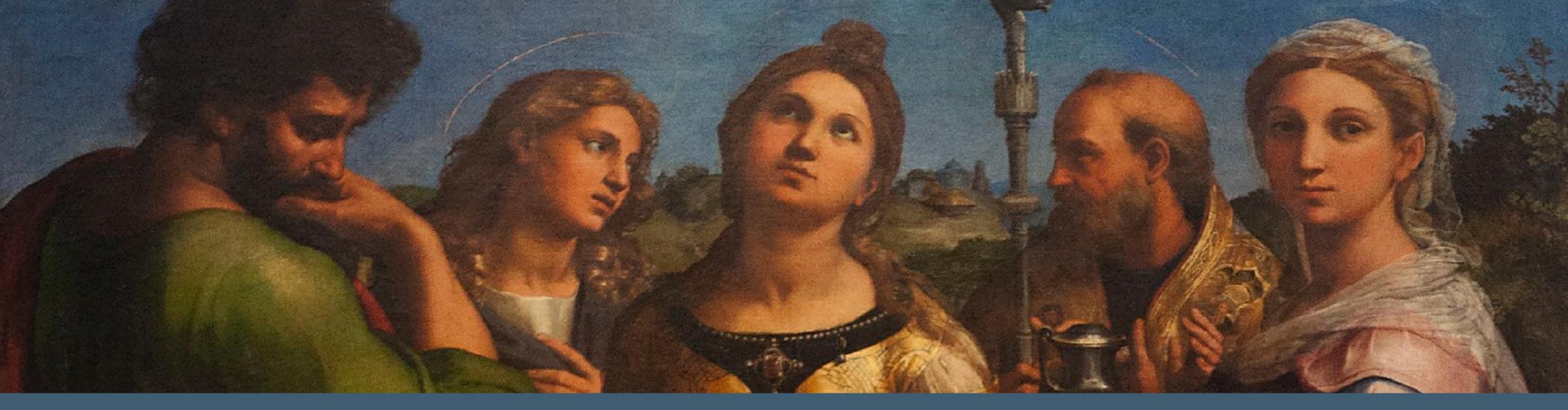
A. Paul is explaining how men and women should behave in the church. (v8-10)



B. Paul exerts his apostolic authority to permanently prohibit women from teaching, preaching, or holding the office of elder/pastor in the local church. (v11-12)

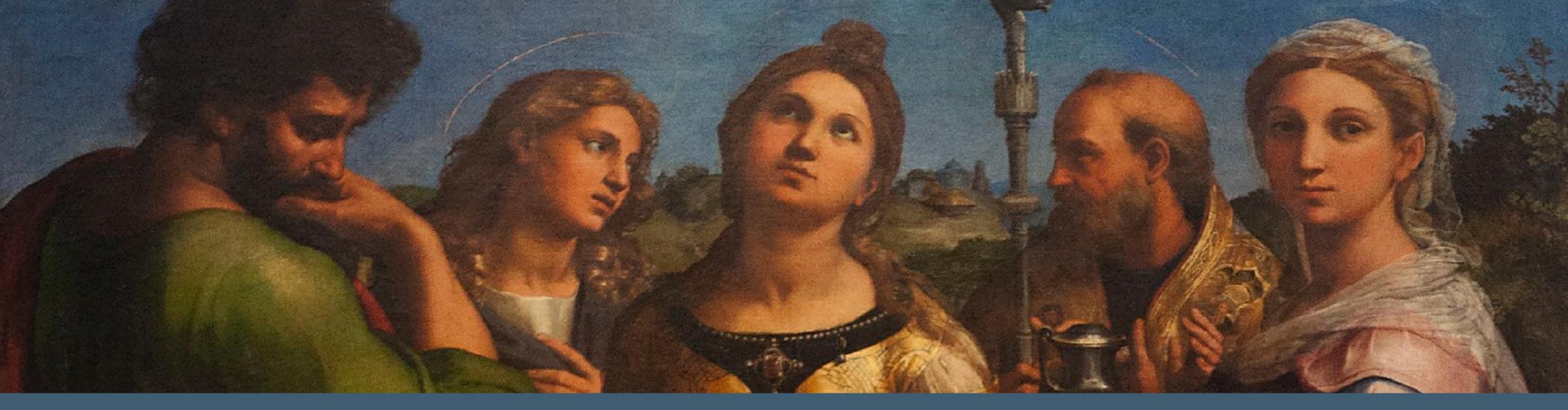


C. Paul roots his argument in the creation order prior to the fall. (v13-14)



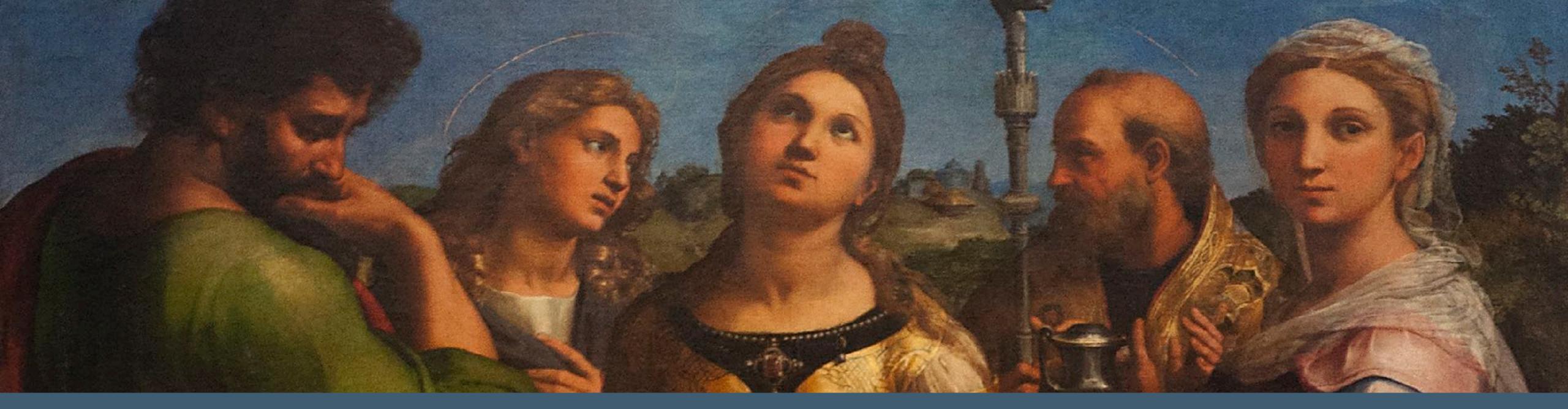
STRENGTHS:

a) It is easy to understand, and it makes sense of the text.



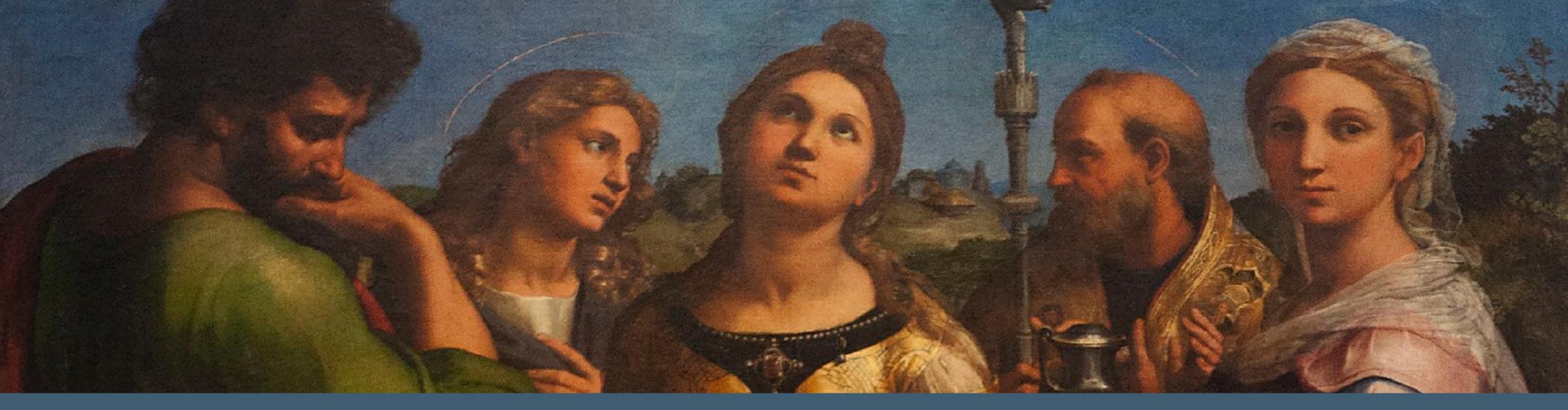
STRENGTHS:

1 Timothy 3:11 (ESV) Their wives likewise must be dignified, not slanderers, but sober-minded, faithful in all things.



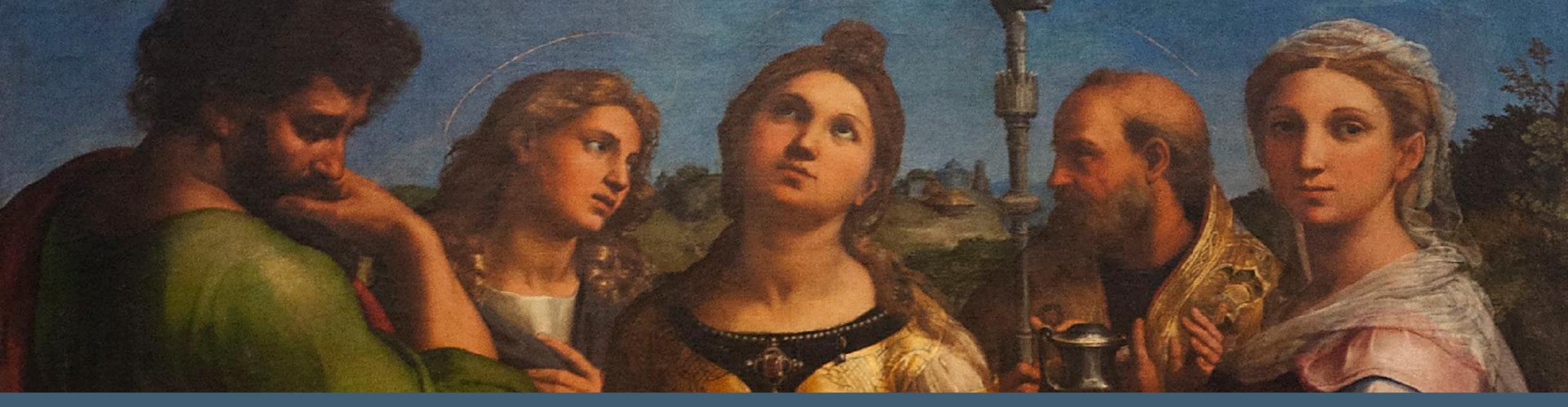

Then Miriam the prophet, Aaron's sister, took a timbrel in her hand, and all the women followed her, with timbrels and dancing.



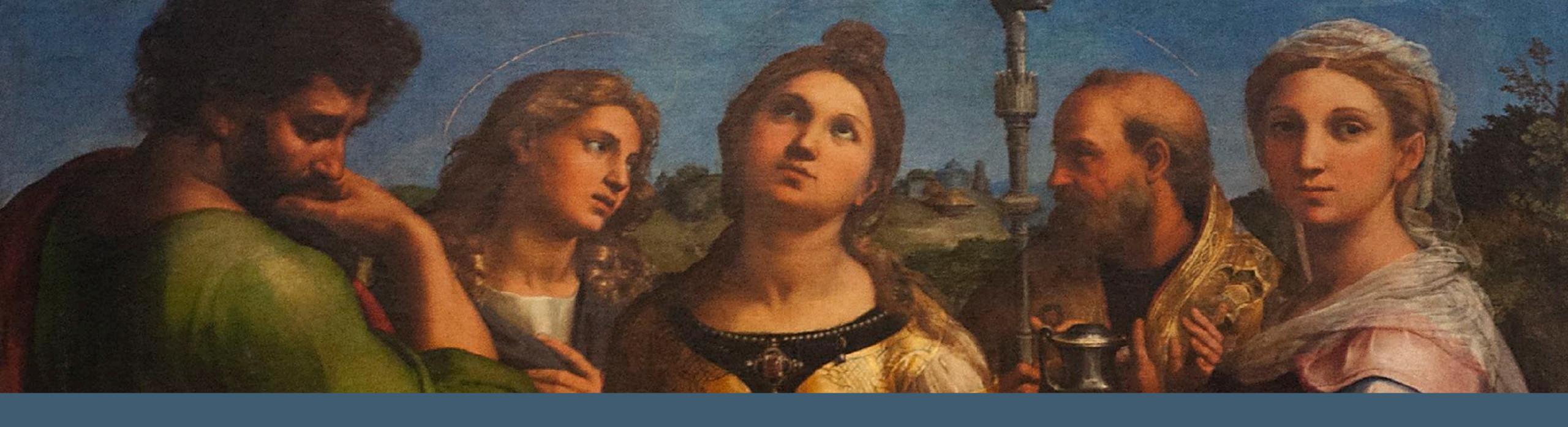

1 Corinthians 11:4-5 (NIV)

Every man who prays or prophesies with his head covered dishonors his head. 5 But every woman who prays or prophesies with her head uncovered dishonors her head—it is the same as having her head shaved.



1 Corinthians 11:7-10 (NIV)

A man ought not to cover his head, since he is the image and glory of God; but woman is the glory of man. 8 For man did not come from woman, but woman from man; 9 neither was man created for woman, but woman for man. 10 It is for this reason that a woman ought to have authority over her own head, because of the angels.
